TARGET AUDIENCE:

Registered dietitians (interns and specialists), physicians (specialists in intensive care, dermatology, neurology, gynecology, nephrology, gastroenterology, oncology, pediatrics, neonatology, endocrinology, rehabilitation, psychiatrists, and geriatrics), and nurses (of all specialties)





OBJECTIVES:

- Acquiring the skills to perform thorough assessments of patients' nutritional needs and to evaluate their dietary intake.
- Understanding the principles of medical nutrition therapy for different conditions such as diabetes, cardiovascular diseases, gastrointestinal disorders, nephrology, geriatrics, pediatrics, and more.
- Gaining insight into the administration of specialized nutrition support, including enteral and parenteral nutrition, for patients who cannot consume adequate nutrients orally.
- Developing effective communication skills to provide nutritional counseling to patients, including behavior modification techniques and patient education.
