## Future of Health Leaders Examine Worldwide Healthcare Workforce Challenges, Lay Out Recommendations for Change

New England Journal of Medicine Catalyst paper takes deep dive into growing healthcare workforce crisis – analyzing causes and presenting tangible steps to address challenges

**RAMAT GAN, Israel – December 8, 2022** – In a paper published yesterday in the <u>New England Journal of Medicine Catalyst</u>, five key members of <u>Future of Health</u> (FOH), a global organization that grew from an initiative established by <u>Sheba Medical Center</u> in Israel, take a deep dive into the growing healthcare workforce crisis – analyzing the causes and laying out recommendations for change.

The paper assesses how to drive change in multiple facets of healthcare workforce design and planning, including medical education and training, care team delivery, and leadership roles from the front line to the C-suite "The pandemic-related staffing shortages unmasked a key vulnerability in our health and healthcare ecosystem and resulted in severe access waits, delays, and forgone care dramatically increasing the burden of illness in our communities," the paper states.

"As an industry, we have an opportunity and an obligation to embrace and lean into the future. This will require leadership, collaboration, and a clear vision. We will need to attract and retain the very best workforce to serve our patients ad communities," it concludes.

With particular focus on healthcare technology and care delivery teams, FOH members identified the top five imperatives that must be prioritized for the healthcare workforce of the future:

- 1. The need to embrace change
- 2. The need to understand and address workforce dissatisfiers
- 3. The need to ensure vertical commitment within healthcare organizations

- 4. The need to establishing clear and committed leadership
- 5. The need to educate the workforce to thrive with the tools and care delivery models of the future
